

President's Message - A Gospel Reminder

I don't think I need to remind you about the story of God's salvation, No, I want to present a reminder as to why our encounters



with visitors during FCFC events should be limited to presenting just the Gospel.

Last week, I had an opportunity to talk

with a few liberal-minded non-Christian friends. The ladies were chatting about the widely popular TV series called "*The Handmaid's Tale*". Not being TV literate whatsoever, I asked why they thought this program was so special. Turns out that it has won 46 prizes and "universal acclaim" from the critics. It's the perfect feminist nightmare story where the U.S. government has been taken over by a totalitarian group. Pollution had made many people sterile and the remaining fertile women were being enslaved to act as breeders for the political elite.

What bothered me is that the villain government was run by a so-called Christian fundamentalist group who subjugated women and killed their opponents to form a theocracy called the *Gilead Republic*. The TV series depicts prayers to God, hymns like "*Onward Christian Soldiers*" and quotes Bible texts. It's a Christian version of extremist Islamic state complete with Taliban-like fighters and ISIS-like ideology. I'll spare you the details available on Wikipedia, but I was dumbfounded to see that my friend's anxieties centred on the overtly "Christian" characters who hold the series' most evil roles.

Of course, it would have never

crossed the mind of the politically correct producers to quote verses from the Quran or to presume that the United States had turned into an Islamic or Jewish authoritarian theocracy. No, that would be Islamophobic or anti-Semitic! But it seems that, for a significant segment of the population, Christianity has increasingly become an appealing soft target.

So, what's my point and what's my Gospel reminder? It's **NOT** that we should modify or sugar-coat the basic Gospel story as expressed in the Five-Colour story. Not at all! To some, the message of Christ will be "*a stone of stumbling, and a rock of offense*". (1Peter 2:7-8) ... "*for the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing*" (1Corinthians 1:18).

On the other hand, I'm alarmed when we receive complaints that we, as presenters, are seen as the "rock of offense" to visitors for reasons other than the **Gospel**. Some might be upset because we have allegedly criticized the beliefs of visitors belonging to other religious groups, and others might contend that we have offended students. I realize that this is largely a matter of differing perceptions: a single wellintended presenter can be over zealous and the visitor can interpret this as pestering. But unfortunately, at the end of the day the cumulative impact of a single misquided volunteer is nevertheless very damaging to FCFC's future ability to share the Gospel in public events in spite of the fact that most volunteers do a great job and that the vast majority of visitors are thoroughly pleased with our approach.

If we want to continue sharing the Gospel in the "marketplace," we need to be increasingly sensitive to the present social trends which indicate that our fellow citizens are more intolerant towards perceived criticism of other religions and may also be more critical towards Christians as a whole who are too often maligned in the media as being hypocritical, intolerant, racist or even violent. I believe there are numerous reasons for that, but the bottom line is that we need. as a group, to bring some corrections to keep us folks on script in order to confine ourselves to sharing the Gospel with a positive approach, which can generally be **done in 2-3 minutes**. The conversation that follows the presentation of the colours can be extended **if** the guest is showing an active interest (good eye contact, it's a twoway dialogue and not a monologue on our part), and **if** other volunteers are available to welcome new visitors coming to our booth.

We can answer questions **about the Gospel**, but we should politely avoid getting sidetracked about religious groups, Mary, UFOs, homosexuals, etc. in order to concentrate on the Gospel. For example, if someone asks: "*Are you Catholic*?" I could reply: "*You might have noticed that I did not talk about any particular religious group in my presentation. In this way, we avoid bickering about religious differences and we simply present the story of the love of God in Jesus.*" If the person asks: "*What do you think about homosexuality?*' I could respond: "I'm sorry, we are not here to comment on people's sexual orientation, but we believe that the message of the love of God in Jesus is for everyone." Moreover, we should consider offering a follow-up meeting if the discussion on the Gospel stretches out, since the visitor will likely raise objections related to some of these other subjects mentioned above. The comparative advantages of Christianity relative to other spiritual options and the distribution of literature targeted to the specific needs of visitors can be more appropriately undertaken at a future meeting following the booth visit.

My reminder is that God's calling to FCFC is **not** to debate or argue with visitors or "to talk them into the Kingdom"—this behaviour is easily interpreted as harassment and is a sure way to getting FCFC kicked out of what would otherwise be precious opportunities to share the Gospel respectfully with hundreds of people who need Jesus. There is no point forcing our message or pressuring the guests to listen or pray, since God is the only one able to draw people: "*No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him.*" John 6.44. We can trust Him to take charge of the souls we meet.

Let us pray for wisdom:

- to wait that GOD bring only the guests which HE has prepared to **listen** to the message.
- that we all be wise and innocent as we go into the world to fulfill the Commission.

The Bead Story:

This is the Good News that the Fellowship of Christian Farmers shares with everyone. We use five colours as a reminder.

Gold: Gold reminds us of heaven, a beautiful place with no sin, pain, or sorrow. A place where Jesus said, "I go to prepare a place for you." God wants us to go there too: "God so loved the world (us) that he gave his only begotten Son ..." John 3:16

Dark: But we have a problem! Sin separates us from God which separates us from heaven. The bad news is that we are all guilty. "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23

Red: What is the solution? Red – the blood of Christ. Two thousand years ago Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came into the world. He led a perfect life and he was crucified for us to pay the penalty for our sin.

White: If we believe this in our hearts, admit we are sinners and sincerely ask for the forgiveness of Jesus, God has promised to forgive us. Then in His sight we are now pure as the white colour represents. This is the Good News! This is a free gift and, like any other gift, if we don't take it we don't get it! Jesus Christ offers salvation to everyone but only those who accept Him as Saviour and Lord receive the gift of salvation.

Green: Spiritual Growth. If we believe, we will want to grow to know God better. We can grow by praying, reading and studying the Bible, being good neighbours, worshipping with others and telling others the good news. What about you? Have you accepted God's gift of salvation
