President's Message Mike Sweeney

Reaching Further and Affecting More than what the eye can see ...

Mankind always leaves a heritage that will affect the generation which follows. The greatest legacy that we can pass on to those coming after us is to know and believe in Jesus Christ. The greatest sin that can affect the next generation is to not believe in Him. Jesus said when the Holy Spirit comes He will convict the world of sin (singular), John 16:9 tell us what that sin is, "They do not believe in Me." This one sin alone will separate man from God for eternity.

A lie can only hold one captive if it is believed to be the truth, and the truth can only remain smothered if it is believed to be a lie or it is not known. Mankind longs to be free, and Jesus said "Know the truth and the truth will make you free", but he must hear the truth before he can know it, and that is the ministry of FCF.

Science tells us it is impossible to create a perfect vacuum ... nothingness. Ungodly leaders have succeeded in passing legislation to get God out of our schools and parliamentary buildings, plus the Lord is no longer Lord in too many of our families, nevertheless man has not created the vacuum he hoped to accomplish, but instead he has replaced the God of truth with the god of this world resulting in a violent and morally decaying society.

Bringing in the Harvest

"Lift up your eyes, look unto the fields; for they are white already to harvest." John 4:35a

As FCF shares the gospel all across the US and Canada I've come to realize that our presenters

fall into three categories, those who are very jealous (aggressive), they feel everyone should pray the sinner's prayer after hearing the bead story. The next group is just the opposite. They prefer to tell the story and go no further in their presentation. And, finally we have a group that does a real good job of presenting the gospel and then give the listener an opportunity to respond by accepting Christ as their savior, on the spot. I wish all of our volunteers would follow this example.

In Ephesians 4:11 we read "God gave some prophets, and some evangelists, some pastors and teachers."

I realize he's talking about ministry gifts to the church, but I believe every one of us, although not called to be an evangelist can still present the gospel, using the colored bead story, in such a way that those hearing can be persuaded of their need for a savior. A few scriptures to support my point:

Acts 17: 3b & 4a "Jesus, whom I preach unto you, is Christ. And, some of them believed." (were persuaded)
Acts 18:4 "And he reasoned in the synagogue every Sabbath, and persuaded the Jews and the Greeks."

Acts 19:8 "And he went into the synagogue and spake boldly for the space of three months, disputing and persuading the things concerning the kingdom of God."

I'm concerned when people leave our tent or booth and they're not given a chance to respond. The first weekend in June found Kathy and me at the Vermont Dairy Festival. Located in Enosburg Falls, NY, it's only about 10 miles from the Quebec border. On Saturday, Derek, a young man in his twenties, stopped by to receive a walking stick. After the bead presentation Derek indicated his desire to receive Christ as his savior. I had the privilege of leading him in the sinner's prayer. Derek had been in drug rehab twice, was brought up in a Christian home but had never committed his life to Christ. He was accompanied by his girlfriend and their young baby girl. I believe she was softened toward the things of God as well. Derek called his mom with the good news and later that evening she stopped by the tent to thank us. Her exact words were, "You were able to do something I could never accomplish with Derek." I assured her that it wasn't us but that the Holy Spirit was working in Derek's life!

A few years ago the FCFI office in Lexington, IL. received a call from a mother thanking FCF for leading her daughter to Christ at a farm show. It seems she and two teenage friends were killed in a car accident on their way home. What a blessing of assurance when the mom ran across the FCF tract signed on the back by her daughter acknowledging she had accepted Christ.

As you consider these two testimonies, my prayer is that you will reconsider your approach to sharing the gospel. May I encourage you to offer the good news of salvation and also give those who hear a chance to respond. Don't be shy, people are waiting to hear. Remember "Today is the day of salvation." May God bless you as you serve this summer. "The fields are white, ready for the harvest."

Transition Coming - Prayer Needed

The year was 1996 and a February weekend away from farm chores found us at the New York Farm Show in Syracuse. A weekly publication called 'Country Folks' was selling introductory subscriptions for \$1.00. I signed up and we began to receive 'Country Folks'. One week while browsing through the paper we noticed an advertisement for a Christian Farmers conference in Morrisville, NY, scheduled for the beginning of August, and one of the contact people was a guy by the name of Bill Brown. He welcomed us and so began our connection with the Fellowship of Christian Farmers International.

The walking stick came on the scene and we met Dennis Schlagel who gave us a demo at the 3-I Farm Show (lowa) in 1999. Then in 2000 Bill Brown brought the walking sticks to the International Plowing Match in Elora, Ontario and we were invited to take part. Life for us has never been the same since. What a blessing and joy to be able to share your faith!

Since then, Edith has been involved as Secretary for 3 years, administrator for 9 years and has put together the SOWER beginning with the first edition in 2002. I have had the privilege of serving as a board member for FCFI for 6 years. FCFC has given me the

titles of vice-president, president, and the last eight years as executive director. There were some difficult spots but looking back, it has been a joy to serve. The fellowship with brothers and sisters in the Lord from BC to NS and into the USA has been something that we cherish deeply.

The problem is that that 50 year old who signed up for 'Country Folks' has had twenty-one birthdays since then and as we slow down we realize that we need to step away and allow younger people to carry on the tasks on a full-time basis. Edith has requested a replacement for October with whom she would work to finish out the year. I have asked to be replaced before July 31, 2017. So FCFC is looking for an administrator for this fall and an executive director by next summer.

I am 62 years old, married to Sharon and we have four adult children, plus four grandchildren. I was raised on a small farm on Barrie Island, in the Manitoulin District of Northern Ontario. My family left the farm and moved to South Western Ontario, in Grey County, where I spent my adolescent years. I was not a Christian and church had no part in my life yet over the course of a weekend youth retreat I made a commitment to follow Jesus Christ. I had no idea what that meant but made a decision to find out and my life journey began. My fumbling attempts of that naive time have strengthened into (44 years later) a passionate desire to serve God. At the age of fifty, I returned to school studying Pastoral Ministry while still working full time as an Electrician, at General Motors. I knew this was God's will but I did not understand how God intended to use me.

Through a series of events that can be deemed as miracles, within five years time - I retired, graduated with my degree and joined the staff of a church in Exeter, Ontario. It was there that I was first exposed to the unique and wonderful evangelistic ministry of FCFC. I observed people who had never witnessed and very nervous, within minutes confidently

sharing and convincing the lost to be saved.

To the church of the Thessalonians, Apostle Paul commended them as a good example for –

"Is it Worth the Trouble?"

Occasionally I have heard this question "Is it worth the trouble?" from Christians often

discouraged by the hardness of the hearts of the people to whom they had tried to witness. It is true that the work of evangelism is rarely rewarded by visible and measurable signs. Sometimes you can talk to hundreds of people about Christ without anyone making a decision to give his life to Jesus. Evangelism can be compared to the work of a sower. If we carefully read Jesus' parable of 'the Sower'... the sower scatters the precious seed everywhere, on the road, in rocky soil, among the thorns and on the good soil. The results are different but he does not worry as his goal is to seed and not to make them grow.

When I was about 13 while walking to visit my mother in the hospital, a woman ran across the street to give me a Christian tract on salvation telling me to be sure to read it! This is what happened. This strange encounter and the short story that I read would remain in my head for nearly ten years - up to the day I accepted my Saviour. As the Lord said 'one sows, another reaps' (John 4:37). I never saw this woman again but her work produced fruit. She was not the only one to share the gospel with me: TV programs, lectures, teaching and finally the witness of my brother-in-law was necessary for the Holy Spirit to convince me of the truth. I sincerely believe each time we share the 5-colour message, we sow.

There are different types of soil, but we must continue to seed everywhere. In a brief or long time, we can hope to see the seed germinate as this is what should happen. Our attitude must always look forward to the harvest even if the soil is parched and dry. Now is the time to seed because if we are believers today it is because a sower did his duty in the past. Our society is based on the 'here and now', but the Lord said "lift up your eyes and look at the fields - they are already white for harvest." John 4:35b.

In conclusion, I would like to tell the story of the little boy who was returning starfish which were marooned on the beach back to the ocean. A man asked him why he was doing this. The boy answered that he wanted to save them. But the man said that because there were so many it would not make a difference because the vast majority were still going to die.

The boy responded as he threw a starfish into the ocean, "for this one it makes all the difference".
