Blest be the Tie that Binds By Bert Visscher, Trillium Chapter

Do you know that hymn written by C. Michael Hawn. Let's look at the words.

The tie that binds is the love of God and His great gift of eternal life. The hymn speaks of fellowship - fellowship with the Father - but also fellowship with each other especially when we share His love.

As the hymn continues it talks about sharing our burdens with the Father and each other and I think of our prayer partnership and our ability to do that through the venue the FCFC provides.

Verse four is a sobering verse as it speaks of death but the ultimate hope and assurance of eternal life is shared at the end of verse 4 and all of verse 5. You know that is exactly what we share when we tell the great salvation story.

We tell people that we are dead in sin (the dark bead) which separates us from God (the gold bead) but because of His great love and sacrifice (the red bead) we are free and pure (the white bead) and out of thankfulness we grow in Christ (the green bead).



Now the reason I looked up the words of "Blest Be the Tie That Binds" is that I was looking for a way to tell the story of our new cord or tie that ties our beads together on our sticks.

A little more than a year ago Tony DeBoer one of the owners of Syfilco (industrial plant that makes bale netting and tile filter among it's many products) said they would make cord for us and donate it to the FCFC. A very generous donation. That cord is sold at a reasonable price to chapters which in turn supports our headquarters and staff. You can see in the picture Tony DeBoer holding a spool of cord in front of the machine that makes it.

There are 1000 meters on a roll. The Trillium Chapter of the FCFC said we would cut all the cord so Henry Post designed a way to thread it on a spool and we cut 200 cords at a time with a hot knife. The other picture shows Tom Verhoog doing that. We did 40 rolls this year with the result of 100,000 strings. Just imagine 40 kilometers of cord.

So the next time you tie the beads, or tell the story, just remember the message of "Blest be the Tie that Binds".

And when you see the cord just remember what Paul Harvey used to say "And now you know the rest of the story".

The Fellowship of Christian Farmers again had a booth at this fair in the shadow of Toronto's CN Tower.



visitors from the full Toronto mosaic came to the booth. It is a unique opportunity to be witnesses for Jesus to the peoples of the world.

300,000 people attend the Royal each year and we thank God that this mission field remains open as we have the opportunity to return in 2019.

Paul Booker shared this testimony of this year's Royal experience:

"A young woman came along; one of our volunteers shared the message with her but didn't push for prayer. A little later this woman returned and said, "I want to learn more about Jesus." It emphasized to me that this is the Holy Spirit's work; it is he, not us, who touches hearts."

Again at the **Salt Spring Christmas Craft Show**, ours was the only booth that offered the true message of Christmas. **Pastor Dennis Scott** has helped us every year. He is always a delight to listen to as he presents the story of the five coloured beads. When Dennis comes to the red bead he tells them, "Now the red bead reminds us of the Christmas Story, when Jesus came to earth as a baby at Christmas time". He then goes on to tell them about the red blood of Christ shed on the cross for our sin, and so on. Among 200 vendors at that show, I think Dennis is the only person who talks about the Christmas Story and about baby Jesus.

Pacific Agriculture Show, BC, January 2019



This was the second consecutive year our Fraser Valley Chapter entered this huge machinery and

agriculture show. Initially, back in January 2014, this was the very first show that Henry was invited to attend as a volunteer and the first time he had even heard of FCFC. That was when Henry got excited with the simplicity of

sharing the Gospel using a simple stick with 5-coloured beads attached with a leather shoelace, with folks just lined up waiting for that free walking stick.

One of our volunteers had the thrill of leading a person to receive Jesus as his Lord & Saviour for her first time. This was the second time she had volunteered with us and the first time she was blessed to be in the "harvest". You should have seen her excitement! So while we are there just to sow the seeds of the Gospel, occasionally we are also blessed to see those seeds take root and change someone's life for all eternity. God always knows exactly when and which one of our volunteers needs that extra encouragement to carry on with the task of sowing more seeds.



Some of the folks who wanted to be sure of where they would spend eternity after death, and prayed to receive Christ as Lord & Saviour were:

- A Dad with his two young teen-aged sons, all prayed to accept Jesus.

- A young married couple from Chilliwack. The wife had accepted Jesus as a young girl and was now unequally yoked. Her husband wanted the peace of knowing God and to know they would be together in the same place after death. They both committed to start going to church together the following Sunday, and wanted to try the evangelical church near their home.

- There are always so many stories that could not be recorded in our reports but they remain in our hearts forever, and that is what spurs us on to do it again and again! There is simply no life for a true believer than to share the good news of the Gospel over and over. We are just one beggar telling another beggar where to find bread. The bread of life! It is always such a thrill to see our volunteers get excited about sharing the Gospel one by one and in so doing to actually witness their own growth as they venture out to do what we are all commanded to do in scripture, i.e. "Go into all the world and preach the Gospel".

SIMAQ (Industrial & Farm Equipment Show)

A year ago, at the beginning of February 2018, the Capital City Chapter (Quebec City) asked me to find another event for the region. I contacted SIMAQ (Industrial & Farm Equipment Show) with the goal of renting a space at the show. When I called, I asked if I was speaking to the right person for that, and he replied, "Certainly, you are talking to the Big Boss."

He asked "Who are you?" When I replied "Fellowship of Christian Farmers – Canada", he responded "What!?" and proceeded to ask me the same question twice again, then he responded after the third time, "What on earth is that?!"

And here we had an excellent discussion which lasted an hour. He then told me that he would look after a space for us and it would be free. Wow! He told me to contact him again in October and I did. He sent me a contract by email – no charge.

As a result, I returned from the Dominican Republic after two months to help set up this event in January. Immediately upon my return I met with the Board of the Capital City Chapter and then proceeded to the Lake St. Jean area for a training session. Following this, because of bad weather, I decided to stay there for the night.

The return road qoes through Laurentides Park and I decided to stop at the one available stop even though I did not need gas. God was looking after me because that ten-minute stop prevented me from being part of a pile-up down the highway. After being stopped for four hours I was able to proceed in - 40° wind chill. The next morning it took some time to get going. A ball of ice had loosened the muffler - it had to be tied up with wire, and an inch and a half of ice had to be removed from the pickup.

And for the event itself, in spite of having a small booth in a less-travelled area, twelve volunteers from ten different churches 10



shared the gospel with 1,100 visitors. A lady, one of the organizers of this event, had visited our booth at the National Women's Salon last November and a volunteer had presented the gospel. She told the volunteer that she would be at SIMAQ and would collect her walking stick then. As she was leaving, an older couple asked where she got the stick and she directed them to our booth. She told us, "There are not enough people like you. You do an excellent work. I hope you come back next year."

Jessynia Théagène: "It was a very busy day. People came by the dozens!. I compared the love of God to the love of a forgiving mother, because she loves her child. However, I told them that the love of God was greater than the love of a mother. People seemed to grasp the scope and importance of forgiveness and the love of God. There were people who shouted when I said the name of Jesus or when I mentioned sin. Others said that we were part of a sect. It was only a small percentage of visitors. Most people were receptive. I have never talked so much about Jesus in an event since I joined the Fellowship of Christian Farmers!"
