Picnic Table Outreach

At the International Plowing Match held in Walton I had the privilege of sharing the good news of salvation sitting under an umbrella at a motorized Picnic table. Yes, you heard that right. My brother from another mother made a motorized Picnic table that draws lots of lookers. He was so kind to lend it to us for a week. I would sit at the controls under the umbrella and watch the crowd go by. People would be invited to get a walking stick by greeters and go through our tent. Lots responded but some just weren't interested and would walk right by.

I would watch the crowd to see who was looking at the table I was sitting on and say "You need one of these for your place". They would come over for a better look and I would tell them all about the table. That conversation would lead to why we have the table there and I would offer them a walking stick with the story of God's greatest gift of salvation.

One young teenager sat at the table to eat his fries. I could tell he was visually impaired and as he is eating he starts feeling around and asking me questions about the table. I got to share the story of the beads with him, carefully explaining each color and its significance even though he couldn't see them. His mom or guardian was sitting nearby and seemed very appreciative. They were on their way to a tent as he was a singer and I was invited along.

One of the crowd was a person I know who is a welder in our area. Of course he had the ability to make something similar. When I shared the story of salvation with him, his girlfriend encouraged him as she was a believer. No, he didn't accept the message of salvation at this time but I believe a seed was sown and maybe it's his girlfriend that will water it, or maybe someone else, but we will leave that up to God.

I had two fellows come by to look at the motorized beauty and they had a strong accent that I couldn't recognize. It turned out they were from Ireland. They were quite interested in the table but not one bit interested in the story of salvation. They sat at an adjoining bench and another person came and I shared the story with him. His eyes just lit up and he said he heard that story on the boat as he was emigrating from Ireland in 1954 as a 20 year old and it changed his life.

He then proceeded to share with the men on the bench and they shared a lot. Only God knows the final outcome in this scenario but I just stand amazed at who He brings at what time.

I could go on and share more but you get the picture. God uses all kinds of tools to bring people into his Kingdom. He can use me, he can use a motorized Picnic table, and He can use you. Let's get creative to further His Kingdom.

It was a joy working together with other chapter members from Ontario and Quebec at the Walton International Plowing Match. There are two encounters I would like to share that left an impression in my mind.

The first was of an adult family of four; a husband and wife, their grown son, and the wife's mother. After sharing the "Good News" all of the family did not hesitate to pray to receive Jesus. After welcoming them to the family of God, I asked if there was a bible believing church in their area that they could attend. They said yes and it was then that the wife told me of how she had been a personal caregiver for a Christian woman whom she knew had been praying much for her. She described how she had been observing the woman's church family as they would faithfully come to visit, bringing meals and helping wherever they could. Their loving care was a genuine expression of Christ's love and a testimony that was used by God to help bring this woman and her family to salvation! This reminds me of:

Matthew 5:16, "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven."

The second encounter that touched me deeply was when a young father and his two children, approximately 9 and 7 in age, sat with me to hear the gospel message. His genuine humble response was an example to his children. The older child wanted to pray to receive Jesus also. When I asked the Dad if there was a bible believing church he could go to with his family, he did not hesitate to share that he would be attending the church of his

faithful wife and parents. I had the privilege of hearing a little of his testimony that day and couldn't help but express that I wished I could see the response from his wife and her parents when they come to realize that their years of praying this man into the kingdom had finally come to fruition! This reminded me of :**1 Peter 3:1-2, " (NIV) ¹ Wives, in the same way submit yourselves to your own husbands so that, if any of them do not believe the word, they may be won over without words by the behavior of their wives,^(BLB) ² having witnessed your respectful, pure conduct."**

So often when witnessing others respond to the "Good News" in faith, we come to understand that we are seeing the harvest because of the faithfulness of others who have planted and watered the precious seed of the Word of God into the lives of whom God has given the increase.

British Columbia Chilliwack Heritage Days

Regulations: As in previous years, No Political or Religious Entries allowed. So after submitting our application in Feb. 2016, they discussed it within the Board and with persuasion from several Christian Board Members, they ultimately voted to make an exception to allow us entry. That was last year, and before the show was over we had a formal invitation to join them again in 2017, which we graciously accepted.

We had the opportunity to share the Gospel story with only about 500 folks, as attendance was way down, possibly due to all the forest fire smoke in the air from all those raging fires burning just northeast of Chilliwack. We gave away hundreds of free gifts, Gospels of John, and literature! It was considerably less than anticipated yet still very rewarding.

In the 3 days we were blessed with a good mix of both Christians and non-believers, and as a result we had the joy of seeing folks come to a saving faith in Jesus Christ. One of our connections from a class Carol & I hosted with the "Alpha" program in Abbotsford brought her young friend and the friend's mother with her whole family to get a stick and to hear the Gospel. After sharing the story, 2 family members and the boyfriend all received Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior! How exciting!

We are continually reminded that while some shows are very hectic and extremely busy, others are much more relaxed and slower than anticipated. And, while we would like to design each one to our own liking, God always seems to have a better plan. Then when it is all over, we know His plan was the best plan after all.

Sept 16 - We had a great location all by ourselves against the back fence next to the "kid's zone", so we could easily be found in a high traffic area. The day was absolutely perfect in every way!

One of our first-time volunteers told us after sharing the Gospel using such a simple method with over 30 individuals, he was amazed by how intently folks allowed him to finish the whole story before confronting them with their own eternal destiny. Never before has he had such an open door to share with so many interested individuals. Now Bill can hardly wait for our next 3 day Pacific Christmas Craft Show event in November!

Among the 400 folks who came for a stick or other free gifts, we had the joy of meeting with 3 young University students who joined up to attend this Agassiz Fair. One gal came from Vancouver, one from Maple Ridge, and another from Mission B.C. Much to our amazement, not one of them had ever heard the Gospel presented to them before, nor had they ever attended any church services. All three eagerly accepted the opportunity to receive Jesus as Lord and Saviour and confirmed they would be checking out a church in their own individual areas on Sunday. It was a thrill to see them leave with beaming smiles, each clutching their first Gideon "Love Letter" Gospel of John.

Another opportunity we had was to

share with a middle aged fellow who said he had been hosting 2 fellows with attaché cases. They came to his door every Sunday morning to try to convert him to their way of religion. After we explained some of the different religions available and how all of them come down to the same thing: "What we must do for God" versus true Christianity, which is "What God through His Son Jesus has done for us". This fellow was now ready to receive Jesus as Lord and Saviour. He said he now wanted to study the New Testament we gave him before allowing those two men back into his home for further discussions.

So, all in all, Carol and I concluded on our hour long drive home that God had given us a perfect day after all. We are so very grateful for the many folks all across the country who prayed for us for this day, and yet, we ourselves had far too many doubts. We often think of that old song we used to sing so many years ago, with one line that went like this, "Oh for Grace to trust Him more!" We too long for that same extra measure of His grace to fully "trust Him" in the face of so many uncertainties and variables we encounter in our lives.

Aug 25-27 -This was our second year for a joint effort by Central Plains Chapter of MacGregor MB and the Fraser Valley Chapter of Abbotsford BC, only this time we had our new Red River Valley Chapter of Rosser MB join us as well.

This Corn & Apple Festival is said to be the largest annual event in this province. Our guests came from all over Manitoba and crowded the streets of this small Southern town, as they do each year.

We had a larger crew of volunteers who worked tirelessly over this 3 day week-end, tying sticks and sharing the Gospel. We used Cornie's 10 X 20 tent with one whole side opened up to accommodate our shifts of up to 6 volunteers sharing at the same time, plus another 4 volunteers inside the tent, tying sticks as fast as they could in order to try to keep our 4 large barrels from running out.

The constant pressing crowd never let up all week-end. In addition to those connected with the chapters, our volunteers included 4 enthusiastic young adults from Cornie & Cheryl's church in MacGregor and another 14 from a Winnipeg church, which for them was about a 2 hour drive each way.

Talk about committed enthusiastic workers! The more positive responses the volunteers received, the more excited they became! We also had 4 men from the Morden Men's Prayer Breakfast, plus another couple from Grunthal and an experienced fellow worker from Brandon who joined us, Praise the Lord! Commitments to Christ: From our 6,000 guests, we witnessed many conversions right there in our tent!

We continue to thank God for all your faithful prayers for us. Every prayer was answered with a resounding "yes" from Heaven above! It was just so thrilling and absolutely amazing to be a part of this rich harvest for the Lord! Who could have dreamed this could happen in the "Bible-belt of Manitoba", that a crowd of 35 to 50 people would wait eagerly for a half hour just to get a stick and to hear the whole Gospel message shared one-on-one with everyone who came to our tent.

FCFC continues to move forward Montreal, South Shore, and Abitibi-Témiscamingue are new chapters which began in early 2017. With the addition of these last two, it makes now 10 Quebec chapters across the province proclaiming the gospel through the five colours.

These chapters are comprised of boards and volunteers who have participated in evangelism with us and represent some of the participating churches in a given region. Because of this, they become ambassadors for the ministry in their respective churches.

These volunteers have also shown a certain sense of leadership, have seized the vision, and want to devote the necessary time to see that this type of evangelism reach their neighbours. These chapters become, more or less, the local centres of evangelism. Their engagement becomes for them a sort of discipleship training.

As fieldmen, it is our role to recruit and launch these chapter committees. We

equip, direct, and work alongside until they are able to fly with their own wings. According to Ephesians 4:11-15, that is part of the role of an evangelist.

One of the advantages of proceeding in this manner is to establish chapters and the continuation of the ministry. We don't want to be a passing ministry, or a big fireworks where after a few seconds nothing remains, but a work which we believe comes from God who wishes to establish roots in the different regions of Quebec, Canada, and beyond.

Quebec Field Ministry

Besides the two new chapters, we have had new events in other regions of Quebec: central Quebec (Bois Francs), Expo Victoriaville, and the Laurentians at Mont Tremblant, and in the Gaspé at the New Richmond Fair. At the time of writing, our annual campaign is not finished. There have been 400 volunteers, and we expect to have shared the gospel with 60,000 people at 44 events. More than 6,000 New Testaments have been handed out as well as 6,000 New Life app cards.

At the Cookshire Fair in the townships, I realized that we were there for the ninth consecutive time. Speaking with God in my heart, I said that after all these years, knowing that about 20% of people return to our booth each year, there must be those who know the story of the five colours. The answer came the next day.

A young lady, about eight years old, from a Christian family showed me that she knew the 5-colour story. Often people say they know but when asked to tell the story they are not able. But this young girl told me the whole story. A second girl came and told me she had been coming to the booth for three years and she too knew the story perfectly. I know from these two examples that hundreds, if not thousands, of seeds rest in the spirits of lots of people, of whom many are children, for which the Spirit of God is waiting for the opportune time to descend into their hearts with this new life.

I heard her exclaim softly: "Wow, in Arabic!" This encounter was like the most beautiful gift of my day! It is amazing to see how God is working with the 5 colour gospel story. I felt like I was living the "miraculous catch of fish"! It was wonderful! I did not want to stop sharing this wonderful plan of salvation in Jesus Christ. I praise the Lord for this method of evangelism. May God continue to place in people this curiosity and thirst to hear and know the wonderful story of the colours! "

Our Volunteers, Nancy & Martin shared: Before the Chicoutimi Agricultural Exhibition we were gripped with fear. Even though we are Christians of more than thirty years, people who usually speak in public, and have repeatedly evangelized in various places, we had fear of not knowing what to say exactly, fear of not knowing how to say it, fear of people laughing at us, fear that people are not interested in the message of the gospel, etc. At the event we found that all these fears are unfounded. The prayer, the training given by FCF, the briefing given at the event before the show began, and constructive support allowed us to gain confidence in the first few minutes. To our great surprise, people flocked in large numbers to hear the message of the 5 colours which summarizes the Good News, the Gospel of Jesus Christ."

Here are some unforgettable moments for us:

A woman with a family arrived at the booth, listened to the message, and asks to meet with us again for she had a thirst to know more of this message that she had never heard before. She left her contact information after taking a NT and having a lengthy discussion with my wife.

A family with two children arrived at the booth. The parents were not interested but one of the children (around 10 yrs old) listened attentively and received with joy and excitement this good news. On leaving he exclaimed, "Wow!" He was moved and thanked us and asked for a New Testament.

Another family with two children stopped at the booth. The parents were not interested but one of the children (around 8 yrs. old) listened attentively and then left after choosing a gift. Some seconds later he returned running and said to me: "In any case, I believe in your story." Then he went back to rejoin his parents.

The Bead Story:


This is the Good News that the Fellowship of Christian Farmers shares with everyone. We use five colours as a reminder.

 Gold: Gold reminds us of heaven, a beautiful place with no sin, pain, or sorrow. A place where Jesus said, "I go to prepare a place for you." God wants us to go there too: "God so loved the world (us) that he gave his only begotten Son ..." John 3:16

 Dark: But we have a problem! Sin separates us from God which separates us from heaven. And the bad news is that we are all guilty. "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23

 Red: What is the solution?
Red – the blood of Christ. Two thousand years ago Jesus Christ came into the world. He led a perfect life and he was crucified for us to pay the penalty for our sin.

 White: If we believe this in our hearts, admit we are sinners and sincerely ask for the forgiveness of Jesus, God has promised to forgive us. Then in His sight we are now pure as the white colour represents. This is the Good News! This is a free gift and, like any other gift, if we don't take it we don't get it! Jesus Christ offers salvation to everyone but only those who accept Him as Saviour and Lord receive the gift of salvation.
