A feeling of festivity was tangible as you walked by classic cars, a pen of camels, face painting booths, numerous food venues and yes, even a bunch of armadillos awaiting their racing time. A balmy eighty degree to start the day turned into a warmer afternoon where shade and ice water were coveted. Thinking about home in Ontario, Canada where the current temperature was well below zero definitely made the heat more tolerable. Now to find the booth of the FCFI.

A cell phone call to Bill Brown, an incredible leader and worker of FCFI (*Fellowship* of Christian Farmers International) led me there. How wonderful it was to see the FCFI tent through the crowd, all set up with supplies of walking sticks, beads, pamphlets. A lot of work behind the scenes and preparation for this event! A hearty round of introductions and welcomes with the other volunteers was encouraging and now our privilege starts.

Greeting all of those passing by our booth with a short presentation of the 5 coloured beads.

Gold: The presence of God (Heaven) Dark bead: The evil we do Red bead: God's incredible gift and the shedding of His Son's blood on the cross White bead: Forgiven, whiter than snow Green bead: Growth in our relationship with our Savior

This is the gist of the story as we tell it over and over. Now if you have never done this, I strongly urge you to share. Every time you do, it builds your



own faith and resolve. You will hear wonderful testimonies of people's walk with God. And then you often have the fantastic opportunity of leading someone to the Lord. Oh, what a gift! And to think all of this happened at a Swamp Cabbage Festival.

The Bead Story:

This is the Good News that the Fellowship of Christian Farmers shares with everyone. We use five colours as a reminder.



Gold: Gold reminds us of heaven, a beautiful place with no sin, pain, or sorrow. Jesus said, "I go to prepare a place for you." God wants us to go there too: Yes, "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him would not be lost but have eternal life" John 3:16

Dark: But we have a problem! Sin separates us from God which separates us from heaven. The bad news is that we are all guilty. "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23

Red: What is the solution? Red – the blood of Christ. Two thousand years ago Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came into the world. He led a perfect life and he was crucified for us to pay the penalty for our sin. Romans 6:23: "...but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."

White: If we believe this in our hearts, admit we are sinners and sincerely ask for the forgiveness of Jesus, God has promised to forgive us. Then in His sight we are now pure as the white colour represents. This is the Good News! This is a free gift and, like any other gift, if we don't take it, we don't get it! Jesus Christ offers salvation to everyone but only those who accept Him as Saviour and Lord receive the gift of salvation.

Green: Spiritual Growth. If we believe, we will want to grow to know God better. We can grow by praying, reading and studying the Bible, being good neighbours, worshipping with others and telling others the good news.

What about you? Have you accepted God's gift of salvation?



FCFC Western Ministry Report Henry Janzen, Western Field Representative



On June 4 & 5, 2022, we participated in *"The Home and Wellness Show"* combined with the *"Small Home Expo"*. This show



started out like any other with an <u>evening of training at Starbucks</u> the night before our event, followed by our booth set-up in the large Tradex Arena. We had lots of help to set up with Ed Plett and Abe Wiebe. These guys are always a big blessing to us.

We had so many volunteers to share the message of the 5-colored beads that at times our booth seemed over crowded. However, no one got away with a free walking stick from our barrel without first hearing the whole Gospel message from one of our volunteers. We also had several new presenters who found it much easier than they had imagined to tell the story of Jesus to our guests. What a thrill to equip volunteers who have never taken the opportunity to explain Jesus' death and resurrection with someone. This is a large part of why we exist as a ministry. A huge bonus for many volunteers is to experience the joy of leading someone into a personal relationship with Jesus upon our guest's first time of hearing the bead story. That's what happened to Carol on that weekend. A young lady in her twenties approached her while she stood holding a stick in hand. Carol shared the whole story in her own words, then asked if she would like to invite Jesus to forgive her sin and to take Him as her personal Savior? Carol was not even finished reading the sample prayer in our tract when the lady eagerly started to pray the sample prayer. When she was done, Carol asked her our standard question; "So where is Jesus right now"? Without hesitation the young lady placed her hand on her heart and said, "He's in here". "Why"? was Carol's next question. "Because I just asked Him to come into my heart" was the quick response. With the Joy of the Lord, she left eager to share what she had just done with all her Christian girl friends. That's what she told Carol.

We continue to praise God for this ministry which not only gives us an opportunity to use а walking stick to reach the lost for Christ, but the rare and unique opportunity to help many fellow brothers and sisters already in Christ, to share the Gospel with others for the first time! 


IPM 2018, Chatham-Kent, ON
