

Peterborough Chapter - Mike Sweeney



I participated at the Canadian National Exhibition (CNE) with Brad Wilson, President of the South-Central Ontario Chapter; it was held at the Toronto Exhibition Place from August 19th to September 5th.

The CNE was a new event for the Fellowship of Christian Farmers; God blessed us with such a plentiful harvest. The volunteers had difficulties accommodating everyone.

During the first day of this event, 2100 walking sticks were handed out, with the message of salvation illustrated with the help of the five coloured beads. In addition, the children's gifts and other ministry items. In total, over 12,500 sticks



were distributed during this eighteen-day event and required the involvement of some 1000 person-hours of volunteers! A significant number of the volunteers were also members of the Gideon organization (ShareWord Global), which has been the case in many other events in Canada for many years; A successful cooperative effort.

Volunteers comprised of interdenominational evangelical Christians, collaborate to present the gospel message in 5 colors at marketplace events such as fairs, festivals, trade shows, etc. This is our mission field!

Once again, the Fellowship of Christian Farmers had the privilege and honour of sharing the gospel at the 2022 International Plowing Match (IPM). The IPM was in Kemptville, Ontario, 60 km. East of Ottawa. The IPM boasts that it is the largest event of its kind in North America. The Tent City this year covered 65 acres where 400 yendors erected their tents.

Our faithful partner, brother and FCFI fieldman from New York, Bill Brown, supplied us with tents. A 20X40 foot tent and three 10X20 foot tents, plus tables and chairs for the five-day September event. Thank you to John Macdonald, the Volunteer Coordinator from the Outaouais Chapter team and all who participated in this outreach.

Even though the weather was not always cooperative, as we experienced some rain and cold four out of the five days, we were blessed with 18-20 volunteers each day. This resulted in over 4000 people hearing the Greatest news this side of heaven. And yes, several of those surrendered their life to Christ. This event may cost thousands of dollars and include many hours of labour, yet the results are for all eternity.

FCFC Quebec Ministry Report Jessynia Théagène – QC Field Representative

How good it is to be able to return in the marketplace throughout Quebec and Canada to proclaim the message of salvation in Jesus Christ after two years of the pandemic. This year AFCC districts in Quebec organized 29 events in 2022 in 15 regions. It is estimated that more than 30,000 people have heard the gospel message in 5 colors on a total of 114 days of evangelizing, thanks to the participation of more than 200 volunteers from a

hundred different evangelical churches in Quebec. A total of 2648 portions of scripture were delivered (including the New Testaments and the Gospel of John).

The regional district committees of Mauricie (June 11), Granby (June 18) and Outaouais (November 26) organized Fundraising dinners. These gatherings were an opportunity to raise awareness of FCFC's mission in Quebec, to share about God's faithfulness and to encourage Christians in the region to evangelize.

Thank you to all the committees that met to organize events, for your prayers and for the ministry partners who joined us in accomplishing this mission of God! May God strengthen each and every one of us in all that He gives us to undertake in 2023!



The Bead Story:

This is the Good News that the Fellowship of Christian Farmers shares with everyone.

We use five colours as a reminder.

- Gold: Gold reminds us of heaven, a beautiful place with no sin, pain, or sorrow. Jesus said, "I go to prepare a place for you." God wants us to go there too: Yes, "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him would not be lost but have eternal life" John 3:16
- Dark: But we have a problem! Sin separates us from God which separates us from heaven. The bad news is that we are all guilty. "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23
- Red: What is the solution?

 Red the blood of Christ. Two thousand years ago Jesus Christ, the Son of God, came into the world. He led a perfect life and he was crucified for us to pay the penalty for our sin. Romans 6:23: "...but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."
- White: If we believe this in our hearts, admit we are sinners and sincerely ask for the forgiveness of Jesus, God has promised to forgive us. Then in His sight we are now pure as the white colour represents. This is the Good News! This is a free gift and, like any other gift, if we don't take it, we don't get it! Jesus Christ offers salvation to everyone but only those who accept Him as Saviour and Lord receive the gift of salvation.
- Green: Spiritual Growth. If we believe, we will want to grow to know God better. We can grow by praying, reading and studying the Bible, being good neighbours, worshipping with others and telling others the good news.
